Memo from the Marshall

Cowboys and Cowgirls, Yep, we're halfway through the summer already. We (the board) were trying to think ahead and plan around some holidays and looked at the fourth Saturday in July. Turns out that it falls on the 24th. Feeling that that might be a day folks would like to be with their families, go to a pancake breakfast or parade, a barbeque, or just clean up the yard; I suggested we move our regular shoot to the 31st. And, so as not to compete with Utah War, it was also suggested we hold our shoot at Big Salty (Lee Kay Range in Salt Lake

City). This will be a joint shoot with Utah War and we expect to have a lot of shooters come out. Those of you who might be sitting on the fence, let me help you over. There have been about two years of extensive planning and strenuous labor in developing a CAS range at Lee Kay. They have about 12 bays in various stages of completion, anywhere from roughed out to finished with permanent storefront props. They will have the regional black powder shoot in August and were in the running for the state championship shoot in 2011. In short, it is an up and coming, regional class shooting facility. We want you to come out and see what has been done. The match starts early—8:00 am—so we can be done before it gets too hot. It will be run by our own WD range and match management, will have five stages and a side match, and will cost \$10 flat fee (ladies shoot free with accompanying gent). We hope you will have a nice holiday on the 24th and then

come out and shoot with us on the 31st at Big Salty. Marshall Sly

31 Jul 2010 Match

NOTE THE DATE CHANGE AND START TIME.

The five stages are being written by Texas Slick Willy so they are sure to be fun and interesting. The side match will be Speed Pistol and Speed Rifle using main match guns. Like the Marshall said, come on out for a different feel and see what's been done at Big Salty. Getting there is easy: take SR201 west to the 5600 W. Exit. Make a right on 5600 and then, quick like a bunny, make a left onto the road to the Lee Kay range. (there is a big sign). The Lee Kay complex is a bit down the road and here it gets a little more complex as there are two ways to get to the Big Salty portion. 1) Just as you get to the complex, there will be a rough dirt road on the right with a fence on its left. The adventurous can

take that road to a set of gates in the fence. Left through the gates and find a place to park. 2) For the less adventurous, enter the complex a little farther down at the "formal" entry. Keep to the right as much as possible going through the paved parking lots to another dirt road (not as rough as the first) with the same fence but now on the right. Then straight down that dirt road to the shooting berms.

Theme: Military/Armed Forces

Stages: 5

Side Match: Pistolero

This side match will be a little different for you handgunners. It will be 10 shots on 10 targets with a 10 second max time. The targets will be shot three times using different styles each time: traditional, duelist, and gunfighter. The three run times will be combined to give a final score.
